

LEGAL NOTICE

Sealed bids for the **Golden Triangle Infrastructure Improvement Project – Contract A** for the Golden Triangle Coalition including the Board of Trumbull County Commissioners will be received at their 5th floor office in the County Administration Building, 160 High Street, N.W., Warren, Ohio, until 2 P.M. Warren, Ohio Time, on or before Tuesday, March 24, 2026 @ 2 P.M. and shall be opened and read the same day thereafter. Coalition Partners include the Board of Trumbull County Commissioners, the Trumbull Engineer's Office, the Trumbull County Planning Commission, the City of Warren and Howland Township. Facsimile or electronic transmissions are not permitted.

Copies of the bid package are on file at the Trumbull County Engineer's Office, 650 North River Rd NW, Warren Ohio 44483 between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm where they may be obtained or examined. There is established a fee of twenty dollars and no cents (\$20.00) for said bid package which is non-refundable. Checks are payable to the Trumbull County Treasurer. Cash is also an accepted form of payment.

Bids must be made on the Bid Blank prescribed by the County and shall be filed **(one (1) original & one (1) copy of Contract A)** in a sealed envelope at the time and place hereinbefore designated. Each bid shall contain the full name and address of each person or company submitting same and shall be accompanied by a certified check on a solvent bank, or a bid bond; If a Bid Bond accompanies the bid, the Bid Bond must be in accordance with the "Instructions to Bidders" and payable to the Board of Trumbull County Commissioners, 160 High Street NW, 5th Floor, Warren, Ohio 44481 for each contract the contractor is submitting a bid for the full amount of the bid as a guarantee that if the bid is accepted a contract will be entered into in the proper manner in accordance with ORC 153.54. The check or bid bond of all unsuccessful bidders shall be returned to them by the contracting authority immediately upon awarding the contract or rejection of all bids. The lowest, most responsive, responsible bidder will be selected. A Performance Bond and a two-year Maintenance Bond will also be required from the contractor upon receiving an award of contract.

Federal Participation Disclosure – This project will be partially funded with Federal funds from the United States Department of Commerce, Economic Development Administration and therefore is subject to the Federal laws and regulations associated with that program. Please review the section titled EDA Contracting Provisions for Construction Projects found in the bid/contract document for details.

Bidders are required to comply with the Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) requirements set forth in Section 164.07 of the Ohio Revised Code, and Rule 164.132 of the Ohio Administrative Code.

All contractors and subcontractors involved with the project will, to the extent practicable use Ohio products, materials, services, and labor in the implementation of their project. Additionally, contractor compliance with the equal employment opportunity requirements of Ohio Administrative Code Chapter 123, The Governor's Executive Order of 1972, and Governor's Executive Order 84-9 shall be required.

All contractors and subcontractors involved with the project are subject to compliance with the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. §§ 3141-3148) as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations at 29 C.F.R. part 5. Bidders must comply with the FEDERAL prevailing wage rates pursuant to the Davis-Bacon Act for public improvements related to this project. The project is also subject to compliance with the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act (18 U.S.C. § 874 and 40 U.S.C. § 3145) as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations at 29 C.F.R. part 3, compliance with 40 U.S.C. §§ 3702 and 3704 (the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act) as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations at 29 C.F.R. part 5., compliance with Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, Equal Employment Opportunity, as amended by Executive Order 11375 of October 13, 1967, and Department of Labor implementing regulations at 41 C.F.R. part 60, compliance with all applicable standards, orders, or requirements issued under the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. § 7401 et seq.) and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (Clean Water Act) (33U.S.C. § 1251 et seq.), and Executive Order 11738, Providing for Administration of the Clean Air Act and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act With Respect to Federal Contracts, Grants, or Loans, compliance with energy efficiency standards and policies contained in the state energy conservation plan in accordance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act (42 U.S.C. § 6201), and compliance with Section 6002 of the Solid Waste Disposal Act (42 U.S.C. § 6962), as amended by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act related to the procurement of recovered materials.

Contractors must NOT be listed as an Excluded Party on the (SAM.GOV) System for Award Management (SAM), in accordance with the OMB guidelines at 2 C.F.R. part 180. Contractors MUST have a Unique Entity Identification (UEI) number from SAM.GOV. If your company does not already have a Unique Entity Identification number from SAM.GOV that contains your legal business name, physical address (no P.O. Boxes), start year or year of incorporation, state of incorporation and, if applicable, a national identifier for entities based outside the U.S. then you will be required to request a UEI through SAM.gov. It is the contractor's responsibility to visit the SAM.gov website (<https://sam.gov>), create and maintain a user account, and apply for a UEI.

The project contract contains a provision that require a certification from the contractor stating that they will not and have not used Federal appropriated funds to pay any person or organization for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a member of Congress, officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with obtaining any Federal contract, grant or any other award covered by 31 U.S.C. § 1352; in compliance with the Byrd Anti-Lobbying Amendment.

The attention of the bidders is directed to the requirement that each proposal must be accompanied by a Non-Collusion Affidavit duly signed by the bidder, and a Personal Property Delinquent Tax Affidavit duly signed by the bidder – required by Section 5719.042 of the Ohio Revised Code – thereof. No Payment shall be made on any Contract for which no such affidavit has been submitted.

Attention is also directed to all bidders that Trumbull County adopted a “Drug and Alcohol-Free Workplace Policy” on September 7, 2016, and the terms of this policy also apply to any Contractors directly reimbursed for services through the County; a copy of Policy to be part of proposal, and that each proposal be accompanied by a “Sign-Off Sheet” duly signed by the bidder thereof.

Attention is also directed to all bidders that pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Sections 307.86 and 307.87, effective September 26, 2003, this notice of bid will be published one time only, with the condition that this notice has been posted on the County’s Internet Site on the worldwide web and found at <http://www.demandstar.com/>. This notice may also be found on the Commissioners website at <https://www.co.trumbull.oh.us/Commissioners/Bid-Opportunities>

Trumbull County reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids, and to delete any part of the bids herein.

In the event the contractor refuses to enter a contract, the contractor will be held liable for damages and expenses as provided by law, as per Ohio Revised Code Section 153.54.

Each bid must contain the full name of the party or parties submitting the proposal and all people interested therein. Each bidder must submit evidence of their experiences on projects of similar size and complexity.

Bidders must be listed on the Plan Holder’s List at the Board of Trumbull County Commissioners’ Office to be considered for an award of Contract A.

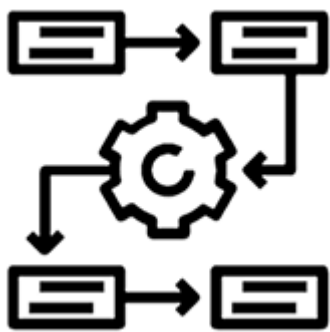

Who We Are.....

The Trumbull County Planning Commission performs several important functions, benefiting the entire population of Trumbull County, numbering over 200,000 residents. The statutory duties of the County Planning Commission are vast and detailed in Ohio Revised Code Sections 711 and 713 and include but are not limited to making studies, maps, plans, recommendations and reports concerning the physical, environmental, social, economic, and governmental characteristics, functions, services, and other aspects of planning, to achieve compatibility throughout the County. In addition, staff assist the Board of Commissioners with fulfilling the required Planning Commission Member vacancies providing advertisement templates, ranking tools, applications, dates of service and more.

The Planning Commission has served as the main point of contact for the decennial census for the last thirty years or longer and performs several functions including assistance with data collection, verification of population and housing counts, identification of Census Designated Places, elimination and/or addition of census tracts and/or block groups, public outreach, and advocacy. In between active decennial census periods staff routinely fulfills requests for census data received by the public, other public officials, non-profits, business partners and more on a regular basis.

Throughout the year hundreds of plats, replats, deed reviews, deed variance requests, review of road vacation requests, zoning map amendment review requests and zoning resolution text amendments are processed for the 24 townships. The staff also provides technical feedback and assistance to the cities and villages on a regular basis upon request. Staff coordinate with title attorneys, surveyors, engineers, public officials, and the residents daily to ensure that the process is streamlined and easy to navigate. Staff provide GIS and mapping services to the public and are working on completing a countywide zoning map that is accurate and accessible online.

Staff serve as the floodplain administrator on behalf of the Board of Trumbull County Commissioners, the responsible entity under ORC 307.37 & 307.85 for floodplain administration. Staff respond to floodplain inquiries, conduct research, interpret the Special Purpose Flood Damage Reduction Resolution and the Flood Insurance Study (FIS) for Trumbull County enabling Trumbull County and its residents and businesses to maintain participation in the National Flood Insurance Program. Staff coordinate with homeowners, consulting engineers, the floodplain variance board, FEMA, ODNR and other public agencies and entities to address ongoing violations and those inherited from issues originating over thirty years ago. Personnel coordinate and conduct permitting and site visits alongside the Chief Building Official. In addition to these tasks, Staff apply for grant funding to address floodplain issues and coordinates Floodplain Variance Board meetings as needed, provides all necessary research and documents to the Board for their decision-making process, and assists the Board of Commissioner's in filling Board vacancies.

Staff serve as the Enterprise Zone designated point of contact and is responsible for administration of the State program at the local level. Staff also serve as the designated Office of Economic Development. Staff coordinates and convenes the Tax Incentive Review Council, a requirement for any community that has active tax incentive agreements (CRA, EZ, TIF). Duties involve coordination and filing reports with the State Auditor, Ohio Department of Development, Board of Trumbull County Commissioner's, Trumbull County Auditor's Office, 13 affected school districts, 12 affected communities and 23 businesses. Staff administer seven (7) active CRA Agreements in coordination with Warren City, Liberty & Brookfield Townships (Lordstown and Niles are not under contract with this office). Staff, upon request, administers the Tax Increment Financing Program on behalf of the Board of Trumbull County Commissioners.

Staff prepare and submit grant applications on behalf of the Board of Trumbull County Commissioners for projects that benefit the various townships, cities, villages, and other community stakeholders throughout the County. Staff provide grant administration services including prevailing wage coordination, labor standards reporting, and serve as the Fair Housing point of contact for Trumbull County. Approximately seventy-five projects have been completed over the past 5 years, benefiting tens of thousands of people.
